One of the primary concerns of firefighters across the state of Illinois is the recurrent possibility that a wildland or field fire could spread to adjacent structures. This class prepares firefighters to make tactical decisions when confronting wildland fires that threaten life or property in the Wildland/Urban Interface. The class includes discussion on size-up, incident action plans, structure triage, structure protection and firefighter safety in the interface. This class is appropriate for engine operators, chief officers and company officers, but leaders from municipal planning, law enforcement and emergency management will also find value in this class. *Class Coordinator: Tom Richter*
