POSITION DESCRIPTION

Function:

The Director of the Fire Officer Program is responsible for the overall administration and management of the Fire Officer Program for the University of Illinois Fire Service Institute. This includes such items as budgeting, scheduling personnel, development of curriculum, identifying potential instructional staff, and training instructional staff.

Required Education and Experience:

- Baccalaureate degree and five years of fire suppression expertise within a career fire department
- Proven experience as a fire office within a career fire department
- Familiarity with IFSI and its programs including direct instructional experience delivering courses in the Fire Officer Program
- Physical capacity to perform most of the same duties as a member of a fire department. This
 includes, but is not limited to, lifting and carrying 50 lbs. or more, using basic fire and rescue
 tools, equipment, and techniques.

- High level of organizational skills
- Experience working with computer software such as Microsoft Office
- Familiarity with curriculum development and design
- Ability to begin quickly, without significant time spent learning the job and building credibility
- Demonstrated record of performance, positive attitude, and ability to work well with others
