Fire Ground Search and Rescue Course Syllabus

Course Title: Fire Ground Search and Rescue

Course Duration: 1-16 Hours

Program: Firefighting

Course Prerequisites: None

Course Description: This class will provide the student with a basic knowledge of search and rescue tactics and mindsets.

This class is designed for the firefighter with at least one year of experience. In this class the student learns basic firefighter skills and hones these skills during realistic exercises. Upon successful completion of this class, the student will walk away with an increased level of basic firefighter competencies.

Course Requirements and/or Recommendations: These can be divided into three categories: those completed prior to arriving in class (Pre-Course Work), those completed during class, such as homework assignments and quizzes (Course Work), and requirements completed after class but prior to receiving a certificate of completion. (Post-Course Work)
