HANDS-ON COURSES

Basic Engine Company Operations:

4 Hours 1 Three sessions available Choose one session: Saturday, 8am-12pm **OR** Saturday, 1pm-5pm **OR** Sunday, 8am-12pm

The Basic Engine Company Operations course is designed for all skill levels. Topics include hose line advancement, searching from a line, ventilation, and getting water to the fire. Students will work in large and small companies to test their skills in multiple operations and scenarios with a variety of smoke and heat conditions.

Required Equipment: NFPA compliant PPE and SCBA.

Compressed Air Foam System: Application of Alternative Suppression Agents

4 Hours 1 Three sessions available Choose one session: Saturday, 8am-12pm **OR** Saturday, 1pm-5pm **OR** Sunday, 8am-12pm

The Class A Compressed Air Foam System: Application of Alternative Suppression Agents course is a great training opportunity for all skill levels and ranks. The course will provide firefighters and fire officers with basic knowledge of foam and foam operations related to Compressed Air Foam Systems (CAFS) function. Topics will include advantages, disadvantages, and cost benefits of a CAFS. Students will engage in hands-on use of the CAFS focused on fire suppression operations and loss control efforts. The course will also include discussion for pump operators as to how CAFS operate and the general maintenance care needed for optimal performance.

Required Equipment: NFPA compliant PPE and SCBA.

Firefighting Tools – What You Need To Know:

4 Hours | Three sessions available Choose one session: Saturday, 8am-12pm **OR** Saturday, 1pm-5pm **OR** Sunday, 8am-12pm

The Firefighting Tools – What You Need To Know course is designed for students interested in learning about effective fireground tool usage and maintenance. Class discussion will be interactive and address tips and tricks of the trade. Experienced instructors will focus on tool usage, cleaning, maintenance, and best practices.

Required Equipment: NFPA compliant PPE.

Basic RIT Operations:

4 Hours 1 Three sessions available Choose one session: Saturday, 8am-12pm **OR** Saturday, 1pm-5pm **OR** Sunday, 8am-12pm

The Basic RIT Operations course is designed for students with a basic familiarity with SCBA usage. Topics include RIT pack techniques, approaches, drags, carries, and ladder removal. Students will engage in live fire, hands-on evolutions that address practical and reactive methods of removing a downed firefighter.

Required Equipment: NFPA compliant PPE and SCBA.

Fire and Arson Investigation (Continuing Education):

12 Hours | Saturday, 8am-5pm AND Sunday, 8am-12pm

The Fire and Arson Investigation course is great for all skill levels. The twelve-hour class will deliver three, four-hour specialized sessions covering essential skills training for fire investigators. The session topics will include photography, fire scene safety, and building and installed systems as they pertain to fire investigation. The course will include classroom discussions and hands-on practicals.

Required Equipment: Work clothes, safety boots, eye/respirator protections, and head protection.

Fireground Search and Rescue:

4 Hours 1 Three sessions available Choose one session: Saturday, 8am-12pm **OR** Saturday, 1pm-5pm **OR** Sunday, 8am-12pm

The Fireground Search and Rescue course is a solid training opportunity for all skill levels and ranks. This course focuses on the primary, secondary and final searches of single and multi-family structures. Vent Enter Isolate and Search (VEIS) techniques and victim removal procedures will also be covered. **Required Equipment: NFPA compliant PPE and SCBA.**

Forcible Entry:

4 Hours 1 Three sessions available Choose one session: Saturday, 8am-12pm **OR** Saturday, 1pm-5pm **OR** Sunday, 8am-12pm

The Forcible Entry course will challenge all skill levels. The class will address techniques needed to safely and effectively perform forcible entry. Hands-on drills will include identification of types of doors and locks as well as tool and equipment usage for inward and outward swinging doors. Students will develop their skills on state-of-the-art training props.

Required Equipment: NFPA compliant PPE, including ear and eye protection.

Large Animal Rescue:

12 Hours I Saturday, 8am-5pm AND Sunday, 8am-12pm

The Large Animal Rescue course is the perfect training opportunity for any first responder who may be required to respond to a large animal rescue incident, including fire, police, EMS, sheriff departments, DNR, and forest preserve officers. The course will begin with four hours of awareness level training that will address the purpose of large animal rescue, incident prevention and evacuation planning, animal behavior, handling, large animal scene management, containment and capture of large animals, and trailer and transport incidents. The final eight hours of the course will involve operations level training that incorporates hands-on drills with the awareness level information. The information and techniques learned will be applied to a full-scale response scenario. **Required Equipment: NFPA compliant PPE.**

Railroad Fire Trailer Operations:

4 Hours 1 Three sessions available Choose one session: Saturday, 8am-12pm **OR** Saturday, 1pm-5pm **OR** Sunday, 8am-12pm

The Railroad Fire Trailer Operations course is a great training opportunity for any student interested in learning how to operate and deploy an industrial fire trailer. Students will gain a better understanding on how to effectively manage limited resources while responding to a railroad emergency. The course will also address how to set up and deploy firefighting foam lines. **Required Equipment: NFPA compliant PPE and SCBA.**

Roof Operations and Ladders:

CLASSROOM COURSES

Active Shooter: Tactical Emergency Casualty Care

16 Hours | Saturday, 8am-5pm AND Sunday, 8am-5pm

The Active Shooter: Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) course is an EMS-based class designed for all skill levels. The class covers topics that decrease preventable deaths from active shooter, hostile, or mass casualty events. The TECC program includes discussions, table top, and full immersion exercises. Upon successful completion of the course, students will receive TECC certification from the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT).

Fireground Simulations for the Chief and Fire Officer:

Students examine how the elements influence tactical and safety decision making on the fireground.
